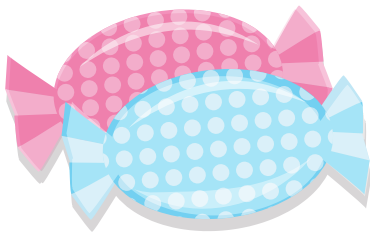


COVID-19 and Oral Health

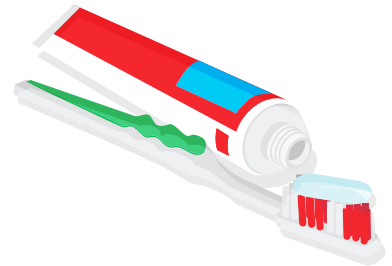
31%

Did not schedule or forgot to schedule a routine dental appointment



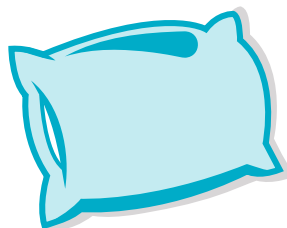
25%
